Background Information

Throughout Canada, standard symbols are used to identify dangerous materials.

- The Workplace Hazardous Materials Information System (or WHMIS) has produced symbols for such work places as science laboratories. These are know as WHMIS symbols.
- The Hazardous Household Product Symbols (or HHPS) were developed for people buying and using materials around the home.

Both of these sets of symbols provide warnings about the possible hazards of using a product, and the necessary precautions to take when using it.
